

And Be Amazed! Mark 9:1-13

Message: November 1, 2020

Key thought: People can learn to respond in positive ways to what happens to them.

Parent Helps:

- · Invite your child to tell about a person with whom he/she enjoys spending time. What makes the person special? Why do you like being with him or her?
- · Explain that today's Bible reading is about a day when Jesus spent time with Peter, James, and John. Jesus invited His three friends to come with Him for a special time with God. They were amazed by what they saw and heard.
- · Read Mark 9:2-13

Discussion Questions:

Younger Kids Questions:

- 1. What is something amazing that you know about God?
- 2. What is your favorite way to spend time with God?
- 3. Why is it important for people to spend time praying, reading the Bible, and going to church?

Additional Older Kids Questions:

- 1. Has there ever been a time when you saw God do something amazing? What was it?
- 2. James 4:8 says to "draw near" (or come close) to God. What do you think it means to "draw near" to God?
- 3. How does being near to God change your attitude and the choices you make?

Apply:

- · Be amazed by who God is. (1 Samuel 2:2; 1 Chronicles 29:11; Jeremiah 32:17; Matthew 19:26; 1 John 4:8)
- · Be in His presence. (1 Chronicles 16:11; Psalm 63:6-8; Matthew 6:6; James 4:8)
- · Be changed. (2 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 12:2; Ephesians 2:10)

Activity:

Invite your child to choose 10 colored candy pieces (such as M&M's™ or Skittles™). Use the colors he/she chooses to help him/her spend time talking to God.

- · For each **GREEN** piece, praise God for something He created.
- · For each **RED** piece, pray for a person you love.
- · For each **YELLOW** piece, pray for a church leader.
- · For each **ORANGE** piece, pray for someone who is sick.
- · For each **BLUE** piece, pray for a person who needs to know Jesus.

Pray Together:

- · Praise God for His amazing power.
- · Ask God to help you spend time with Him, and ask God to make you more like Jesus.
- · Pray that our pastors and staff would not neglect their personal time with God as they seek to lead our church family.
