The Life of Joseph

Sometimes It's Hard

Level of Biblical Learning:

Good and bad happen to people, but God still loves them.

Genesis 39:19-23; 40; 41:1-3

Parent Helps:

- Briefly remind your child about the events of Joseph's life.
- Review this week's focal passages. Emphasize Genesis 39:21-23. Mention that even in prison, God was with Joseph.
- Invite kids to share what seemed to be bad in Joseph's life. (His brothers hated him. He was thrown into a pit, sold, taken from his family. He was falsely accused and imprisoned. The cupbearer forgot about him.)
- Guide kids to share what seemed to be good in Joseph's life. (God had a plan for Joseph. God helped Joseph know and do what was right. God made Joseph successful. God gave Joseph the ability to explain dreams.)

Discussion Questions:

Younger Kids:

- 1. Tell about something good that has happened to you.
- 2. Tell about a bad day. How did God help you?
- 3. How do you know that God loves you?

Older Kids:

- 1. Do you think it is easier to trust God when things are good or bad? Why?
- 2. What can you do during difficult times to help you remember that God loves you?
- 3. How has God helped you through hard times in the past?

Apply:

- God is bigger than any problem we might face. (Luke 18:27)
- Whether things are good or bad, God is always with you and at work. (Joshua 1:9; Isaiah 41:10)
- People can trust God during good and bad times. (Psalm 9:10)
- We may not always know why God allows things to happen in our lives, but we can trust that His plans are good. (Jeremiah 29:11.)

Activity:

Help your child cut 8-10 paper strips. Invite him to color the strips. Guide older kids to write on each strip times they need
to remember to trust God, such as "When I am sad" or "When I miss my friends." Loop the paper strips together to
make a paper chain. Secure each loop with tape or stickers. Hang the chain in your child's bedroom or your family room.
Use the chain as a reminder of God's love during difficult times.

Pray Together:

- · Thank God for His love.
- Ask God to help your family trust Him even when things are hard.
- Ask God to show your family how to be an encouragement to others.
